KMU TODAY FAST FACTS

- Kyiv Medical University founded in 1992 and it is the first private medical university in the post-Soviet countries.
- Today the sphere of our competence is Medical, Dental and Pharmaceutical training in various forms (full-time, part-time, distance-learning), organizing scientific educational events and publications. KMU implements the latest evidence-based medicine data at all stages of its educational process – at Graduate and Postgraduate levels with all available instruments and resources. At the Postgraduate level, the concept of study throughout life is supported, where Internship (Residency), Clinical Residency, Advanced Training, Seminars, Conferences, Symposia of Ukrainian and international scale. All this is done to improve the level of health of the world's population!
- KMU is ranked 1st in TOP-10 BEST PRIVATE UNIVERSITIES.
- KMU is ranked 8th amongst 200 universities based on the average passing score level of Ukrainian citizens of External Independent Assessment.
- KMU is ranked 11th amongst 126 private universities according to the number of admitted students on the contract base.
- In 2020 the number of graduate and postgraduate students has increased to over 3700 participants.
- The atmosphere in the University is unique and diverse as students represent 62 countries.
- In 2017 KMU opened its branch "Kharkiv Institute of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences".
- In 2019 KMU opened its branch "Dnipro Institute of Medicine and Public Health".
- The total number of the students is over 3500, and the number of the graduates is over 5000.
- In 2019 the Department of Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgery, Surgical Cosmetics with the Course of Private Medical Practice Basics was introduced.
- KMU provides education in the field of Medicine, Dentistry and Pharmacy as well as a preparatory course for international students. Postgraduate education is delivered in 22 specialties in Internship (Residency), 14 specialties in PhD, 60 specialties in Clinical Residency and Doctorate program is available in most of the healthcare specialties.
- The University is focused on training specialists in deficit fields such as Pediatrics, General Practice, and Family Medicine according to international standards.
- KMU students can benefit from ERASMUS+ programme that supports education, training, youth and sport in Europe by studying, training, and gaining experience in our partnering university in Poland.



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- International and Ukrainian students are greatly integrated in the cultural and sport life of the University and are taking leading positions in various contests.
- KMU gives University Scholarships to talented students and interns. Overall, 30 grants have been awarded since 2013.
- The University supports the talented youth – straight “A” students are provided with a 50% cut-rate deal.
- The training takes place in 22 departments, 13 of which are clinical, located in the best communal, governmental and private hospitals in Kyiv, Kharkiv, Dnipro, and Odessa.
- Students take part in Vocational Medical Training in clinical facilities of Poland of Katowice area. They also have opportunity to take part in similar training in one of the leading clinics of Germany - Ernst von Bergmann Klinikum (Potsdam, Germany).
- There are over 400 faculty staff members - professors, associate professors, assistant professors, lecturers. Amongst them 1 out of 3 is a holder of PhD.
- KMU has launched an “Opened Rectorate” project that gives students the opportunity to express their voice directly to the Rector.
- KMU has been the first official testing center of TOEFL iBT & SAT exams in Ukraine since 2004.
- KMU regularly organizes open seminars with well-known foreign speakers and Ukrainian prominent health care specialists.
- KMU is a coordinator of the 3-year project on vaccination, prevention of disease in the group of social risks. KMU provides special training supported by UNICEF and WHO for doctors in Kyiv and other regions of Ukraine.
- KMU partakes in the “Quick response to social and economic problems of internally displaced persons in Ukraine” project organized by United Nations Development Programme and the government of Japan. Under the terms of this project, the University has employed about fifty people - highly qualified specialists in the medical and educational sectors - internally displaced persons from Donetsk, Luhansk and Crimea.
- KMU is a partaker of the project sponsored by the US government supported by the Center of Socially Dangerous Diseases.
- KMU conjointly with the Ukrainian Alliance arranged a set of trainings “Technical Assistance in the Field of M&E and Effective Use of Data” (METIDA) for the staff of the Ministry of Health of Ukraine.
