1. General provisions

1.1. Student self-government at the Private Higher Educational Establishment "Kyiv Medical University" (hereinafter referred to as *the University*) is a state-guaranteed right and opportunity to independently or through the executive body of student self-government, called the "Student Council" of the University, resolve issues of study and life, protect the rights and interests of students, and also participate in the management of the higher education institution, as provided for by the Law of Ukraine "On Higher Education".

1.2. Student self-government at the University and the Student Council in their activities are guided by the legislation of Ukraine, the Charter of the University and these Regulations on the Student Council, which are approved by the student conference.

2. Purpose and objectives of student self-government bodies

2.1. The activities of student self-government bodies are aimed at improving the educational process, aimed at high-quality learning, cultivating the spirituality and culture of students, and increasing social activity and responsibility for the assigned work among student youth.

2.2. Student self-government is an activity through which students' creative abilities are maximally revealed and analyzed, moral qualities are formed, and the initiative of each person is increased based on the results of their work.

2.3. The main tasks of student self-government bodies are:

- ensuring and protecting the rights and interests of students;
- ensuring that students fulfill their duties;
- promoting the scientific and creative activities of students;
- assistance in creating the necessary conditions for students' accommodation and recreation;
- creation of various student circles, societies, and clubs based on interests;
- organizing cooperation with students of other higher educational institutions and youth organizations;
- direct participation of students in the implementation of state youth policy;
- coordination of the activities of the head of the district, curators of academic groups;
- involving students in amateur art groups;
- holding evenings of relaxation, competitions, student initiations, graduation parties, faculty days;

- together with the deans and the dormitory commandant, organize proper living conditions, rest and leisure for students in dormitories;
- active participation in the organization, provision, storage and support of the relevant the condition of premises, equipment and other property of the University;
- promotion of a healthy lifestyle, prevention of students from committing offenses, using alcohol, drugs, smoking, etc.

2.4. In agreement with the Student Council, decisions are made on:

- expulsion of students from the University and their reinstatement;
- settling in the dormitory of persons studying at the University and evicting them from the dormitory;
- approval of the internal regulations of the University in the part concerning students;
- activities of dormitories for the accommodation of persons studying at the University.

3. Structure and organization of the work of student bodies municipality

3.1. Student self-government at the University is carried out at the level of the academic group, faculty, dormitory, and the University .

3.2. The highest body of student self-government is the general meeting – the Student Conference (hereinafter referred to as the Conference), at which The regulations on student self-government are approved and the Student Council is elected, its structure and term of office are determined, and the report is heard.

3.3. Student self-government bodies operate on the principles of voluntariness, collegiality, openness; election and accountability of student self-government bodies; equal rights of students to participate in student self-government; independence from the influence of political parties and religious organizations.

3.4. The most important issues of students' life, determined by the main areas of activity of student self-government, are submitted for consideration by the Conferences .

3.5. The decisions of the Student Council and the Conference are binding .

3.6. The Conference meets at least once a year. The bodies of the Student Council of the faculties and the dormitory delegate their representatives (delegates) to the conference in the ratio of one delegate per 20 students. Extraordinary Conferences are convened by the Student Council of the University , or at the request of at least one third of the total number of students.

3.7. The Credentials Commission, which includes the Chairman of the Commission and its members, registers and verifies the credentials of the

Conference participants . The confirmation of the Conference delegates is the student ID card and the minutes of the group meetings.

3.8. The Chairman of the Student Council is elected by open voting of the members of the Student Council. The person who receives the largest number of votes, but not less than half of the votes of those present, is considered elected.

3.9. The term of office of the Chairman of the Student Council is 2 (two) years. He may hold office for no more than two terms.

3.10. The Chairman of the Student Council shall exercise his powers until the election of a new Chairman. In his activities, he shall be responsible to the Student Council.

3.11. The Chairman of the Student Council may be recalled if 2/3 of the total number of the Council voted for such a decision. The recall of the Chairman of the Student Council may be initiated by 1/3 of the delegates of the relevant Council.

3.12. In the event of early termination of the powers of the Chairman of the Student Council, extraordinary elections for the Chairman of the Student Council shall be held within a month.

3.13. The Chairman of the Student Council makes proposals for the election of the Deputy Chairmen of the Student Council and the Secretary, who are elected by the members of the Student Council.

3.14. The composition of the Student Council is elected by direct open voting of student delegates. The total composition of the Student Council is 21 people.

3.15. The Student Council automatically includes student deans and the Chairman of the Student Council of the dormitory.

3.16. The Chairman of the Council organizes the work of self-government bodies , and upon invitation participates in meetings of the Academic Council of the University , where issues of the activities of student self-government bodies and problematic issues of student life are discussed.

3.17. The Secretary of the Student Council organizes control over the implementation of decisions of student self-government bodies, keeps minutes of its meetings and makes reports on the implementation of its decisions.

3.18. Sectors (commissions) are created under the Student Council according to areas of work: educational and scientific, cultural and educational, sports and recreation, social and household, etc.

3.19. A meeting of the Student Council is held at least once a month and is considered legitimate if at least 2/3 of the members elected to it are present. Decisions are made by a majority vote of its members.

3.20. Each meeting of the Student Council is recorded in minutes, as follows: signed by the Chairman and the Secretary.

4. Rights and obligations of student self-government bodies:

. Members of the Student Council have the rights and obligations that are granted to students of higher education institutions of Ukraine in accordance with current legislation and the Statute of the University.

4.2. In addition to the above, members of the student self-government have the right: to elect and be elected to any student self-government body; to address the Student Council regarding issues within their competence and to receive a response on the merits of the issues .

4.3 . Responsibilities Student Council:

- to implement the decisions and requirements of the student self-government, which are aimed at achieving the goals and solving the tasks of the Student Council;
- ensure the protection of the rights and interests of students;
- to carry out its activities on the principles of voluntariness, collegiality, election and accountability of the council bodies;
- ensure equal rights of students to participate in student self-government, independence from the influence of political parties;
- make proposals for the development of the University's material base , including issues related to students' life and recreation .

4. 4. The University Student Council has the right to address the University management with proposals and statements related to the solution of the tasks stipulated by the main areas of activity and self-government. The University administration has no right to interfere in the activities of student self-government bodies.

4. 5. Members of the Student Council have the right:

- participate in the formation of educational program goals and program learning outcomes;
- make suggestions regarding the content of curricula and programs;
- independently form their own interests and needs of students;
- to participate in groups ensuring the quality of the educational process ;
- were members of working groups on self-evaluation of educational programs;
- act as stakeholders aimed at improving and enhancing the quality of educational programs;
- form academic communities and principles of academic integrity, transparency, and impartiality;

- to contribute to the improvement of living conditions of higher education students and the material and technical support of the educational process;
- participate in monitoring the quality of regulatory documents (educational programs of specialties, work programs of academic disciplines, methodological support of the educational process, etc.);
- influence the improvement of the quality of educational activities and the quality of teaching of academic disciplines, practical training, scientific work, etc.;
- provide suggestions for improving the quality of practical training for higher education applicants.
- participate in discussing and resolving issues related to improving the educational process, research work, organizing leisure, recreation, life, and nutrition;
- to conduct organizational, educational, scientific, sports, health and other events;
- participate in activities (processes) to ensure the quality of higher education;
- to make proposals for the development of the University 's material base , including issues related to students' life and recreation.

5. Material and financial basis of student self-government

5.1. The University provides appropriate conditions for the activities of student self-government: provides premises, furniture, office equipment, permanent access to the Internet, allocates places for installing information stands , etc., as stipulated in a relevant agreement .

5. 2. Student membership fees, the amount of which is established by the highest body of student self-government of the higher education institution. The amount of the monthly membership fee of one person cannot exceed 1% of the subsistence minimum established by law.

5. 3. The funds of student self-government bodies are allocated to the performance of their tasks and exercise of powers in accordance with the budgets approved by them at least once a year.

5. 4. The Student Council publicly reports on the use of funds and the implementation of budgets.
